

Small Group Leader

Wednesday night service

The role of the Kids Leader is to develop relationships with the children through play, small groups, example, talk, and hanging out. The Kids Leader participates on a team with other volunteers planning and preparing for their service.

Kids Wednesday Expectations:

- Be here at least 30 minutes before your small group begins with all preparation complete.
- Interact with children as they are playing and socializing together.
- Set expectations for your children, clearly communicating to them that you expect them to participate, show respect for you and others, and be obedient.
- Discipline misbehavior first with a warning. After that refer the child to the team leader.

Kids Wednesday Expectations:

- Fulfill duties assigned by Kids team leader – greeter, host snack bar, supervise play, lead activity, and/or play a role in a skit, etc.
- Attend Celebration Service with children.

Communication Expectations:

- Do your best to find your own substitute when you have to miss a small group time and let your team leader know who it is. If unable to do so contact your team leader as soon as possible.
- Participate in activity and lesson planning with team.

Ministry Expectations:

- Be faithful in your relationship with God; spend time with Him daily, attend a “Big Church” Celebration Service, and teenagers attend student ministries.
- Be spiritually prepared each week.
- Seek the Lord on behalf of the children.
- Minister to the children through prayer, phone calls and cards.
- Be prepared to minister to children and report to your team leader, as follow-up is needed.

Appearance and Behavior Expectations:

- Be an example at all times and display wisdom in the way you portray yourself in public as a representative of Christ and Kids ministry. (This includes social media)
- Always wear a smile and welcoming helpful attitude.
- Appearance should be modest, moderate, neat, clean and well groomed.
- Any part of your clothing or hairstyle that might be distracting, suggestive, revealing, or otherwise draw attention to you should not be worn when you are serving as a jr. leader. If you are unsure about whether a certain look is appropriate or not, it is best to choose something else that you are confident is appropriate.
